The Board of Supervisors of Clinton County, Iowa, met. Present were Supervisors Determann and Irwin. Supervisor Srp was absent from the meeting. Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Claims were approved unanimously

Coronavirus/COVID-19 update: County Community Health Manager Michelle Cullen reported there are currently 261 active cases in the County. She said only 2 new cases have been reported in the last seven days. Cullen said the positivity rate is holding steady and the County is at 38% vaccinated. She said they will start this week working on getting the vaccine to 12 and older. She said the CDC made new recommendations last week that vaccinated people may go unmasked inside or outside, but schools should remain unchanged as most students have not been vaccinated. Cullen said Iowa Public Health said parents should be given the choice on school kids masking and won't need to contact trace for schools any longer. Cullen said a couple of the schools may leave it in place until the end of school since numbers are good. She said a couple may make it a choice. Cullen said a Scott County doctor well respected in the area of infectious disease does not support the changes in school. She said she is disappointed Iowa Public Health suggested making that change so close to the end of the school year finishing and the numbers are looking good.

The Supervisors reviewed the new CDC recommendations in regards to fully vaccinated people wearing masks. HR Director Dawn Aldridge provided the Board with recommended policy changes with regards to the new CDC recommendations. Supervisor Irwin said this is still covered by OSHA.

ORDINANCE 2021-01

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF CLINTON COUNTY IOWA CONCERNING NUISANCE PROPERTY TAX SALES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF CLINTON COUNTY, IOWA:

Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend the Code of Ordinances of Clinton County, Iowa, pursuant to Iowa Code §446.19B, by adding a new Chapter permitting the Treasurer to sell at the annual tax sale delinquent taxes on parcels that are abandoned properties which are, or are likely to become, public nuisances.

Section 2. Amendment. The Code of Ordinances of Clinton County, Iowa, is amended by adding the following new Chapter:

Nuisance Property Tax Sales

1. Consistent with Iowa Code §446.19B, the County Treasurer is authorized to separately offer and sell at the annual tax sale delinquent taxes on parcels that are abandoned property and are assessed as residential property or as commercial multifamily housing property and that are, or are likely to become, a public nuisance.

- 2. On or before May 15 of any year, either the County or any city in Clinton County may file with the Clinton County Treasurer a verified statement containing a listing of parcels and a declaration that each parcel is abandoned property, each parcel is assessed as residential property or as commercial multifamily housing property, each parcel is, or is likely to become, a public nuisance, and that each parcel is suitable for use as housing following rehabilitation.
- 3. The verified statement shall be published at the same time and in the same manner as the notice of the annual tax sale and the requirements in section 446.9, subsection 2, for publication of notice of the annual tax sale also apply to publication of the verified statement.
- 4. On the day of the regular tax sale, or any continuance or adjournment of the tax sale, the Clinton County Treasurer shall separately offer and sell those parcels listed in a verified statement timely received and properly published and which remain liable to sale for delinquent taxes. This sale shall be known as the "public nuisance tax sale". Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, the percentage interest that may be purchased in a parcel offered for sale under this section shall not be less than one hundred percent.
- 5. To be eligible to bid on parcels under this section, a prospective bidder shall enter into a rehabilitation agreement with the County, or with the city in which the property is located, to demonstrate the intent to rehabilitate the property for use as housing if the property is not redeemed.
- 6. If after issuance of a tax sale deed to the holder of a certificate of purchase at the public nuisance tax sale, the tax sale deed holder determines that a building, structure, or other improvement located on the parcel cannot be rehabilitated for habitation, the tax sale deed holder may request approval from the Board of Supervisors, or the city council of the city where the parcel is located, to remove, dismantle, or demolish the building, structure, or other improvement.
- 7. When a parcel is offered at public nuisance tax sale and no bid is received, or if the bid received is less than the total amount due, the County, through the Treasurer, shall bid for the parcel a sum equal to the total amount due. Money shall not be paid by the County or city for the purchase, but each of the tax-levying and tax-certifying bodies having any interest in the taxes shall be charged with the total amount due the tax-levying or tax-certifying body as its just share of the purchase price.
- 8. The tax sale certificate holder may assign the tax sale certificate obtained pursuant to this section.
- 9. For purposes of this section, "abandoned property" means the same as defined in section 446.19A, and "public nuisance" means the same as defined in section 657A.1.

Section 3. Repealer. All other sections of this Ordinance in conflict with these provisions shall be repealed.

Section 4. Severability. If any section, provisions or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall have no effect on the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and publication as provided by law.

DEPARTMENT HEADS, ELECTED OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES

HR Director Dawn Aldridge reported her association's annual conference can work into her budget this year. She said it is in November and it is out-of-state travel. She will present a motion next week requesting approval for out-of-state travel.

County Engineer Todd Kinney reported he is working on a grant submittal with Scott County for a bridge project. He provided updates on other road projects taking place this construction season. He added contract rock hauling started this week. Kinney said his office is short staffed for now so there could be times when there is no one in the office.

Supervisor Irwin said a fence project surrounding the Kuebler Cemetery was dedicated on Saturday and there was a good turnout for the event. He said a soft opening of the resource center at the Clinton County Courthouse took place last week. He said the group will begin promoting it in the next couple of weeks.

Chairman Determann said a pre-construction meeting will take place on Thursday night for the Elvira wastewater project at the Lutheran Church.

DISCUSSION WITH POSSILE ACTION

American Rescue Plan Funds Planning: County Auditor Eric Van Lancker said more information has been released from the U.S. Treasury about the use of the federal funds. He said assisting non-profits with losses during the pandemic as talked about last week will not be allowed. However, he said the rules state the County can recover its lost revenue. He said the funds can assist any projects that address COVID which took place after March 3, 2021. He said many Iowa counties had difficulties early signing in to the program. He said some counties weren't listed, but that has been fixed. He said there are also issues with ID certification. Van Lancker said there is no rush to get signed up. He said that can take place in the next couple weeks. Irwin said if premium pay is not available to all employees who worked during the pandemic then he doesn't think it is right to award to just a few employees as almost all County employees worked during the pandemic. Van Lancker said he would provide more information to the Supervisors about the premium pay as the new rules are very broad about what employees would qualify for the premium pay.

Assessor Office Barrier Installation Options: County Facilities Director Corey Johnson said the Assessor's Office did hang some plastic shields during the pandemic last year, but they would now like something more permanent.

Johnson said the estimate for the project is \$11,300. He said it will need to be decided if the Board wants to move forward and decide who is paying for it. Irwin said the Assessor said he could put \$5,000 toward that project.
