The Board of Supervisors of Clinton County, Iowa, met. Present were Supervisors Determann, Irwin and Srp. Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Claims were approved unanimously

Coronavirus/COVID-19 update: County Community Health Manager Michele Cullen reported Clinton County has recorded 19 positive Coronavirus cases in the last seven days; four in the last three days. She said that has placed the County in the substantial status on the CDC map on Friday. She said hospitalizations for the region is at 60 and only a month ago there were 19. She said Mercy has three and Genesis has 10 whereas a month ago Mercy did not have any hospitalizations and Genesis had four. Cullen added that in hospitals around the state 82% of hospitalizations are not vaccinated. She said Clinton County is at a 46% vaccination rate. Cullen said pharmacies and public health clinics continue to provide vaccinations. She said Clinton County's positivity rate a month ago was 2%, but is currently 7.4%. She said the numbers are going in the wrong direction. Cullen said Scott and Muscatine counties are in the red on the CDC map.

WHEREAS, the Clinton County Sheriff's Office desires to apply for a grant funding opportunity through the Clinton County Development Association (CCDA) for a possible award of \$37,350, which would be used to

purchase equipment related to traffic safety (radar/radar trailers) and search and rescue equipment (thermal imager); and

WHEREAS, the CCDA grant award requires a 25% match of the project total from the Clinton County Sheriff's Office to not exceed \$12,450 if awarded the funding. The CCDA grant funds if awarded would fund up to \$37,350; and

WHEREAS, the provision of said grant requires approval of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Clinton, Iowa to commit funds of said grant, if approved, and

WHEREAS, the Clinton County Sheriff recommends said application to be approved to allow said CCDA application submission process to proceed,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Clinton County Board of Supervisors that the Clinton County Sheriff is hereby authorized the signing of the CCDA grant application submission.

DEPARTMENT HEADS, ELECTED OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES

Supervisor Srp said the EMA board will be meeting soon to review its by-laws and to consider pay wages for those employees.

Supervisor Irwin said the homeless coalition is meeting tomorrow morning. He said there will be an appointment to the Pioneer Cemetery for the Board to consider. Irwin said he doesn't feel he has enough information on the ranking of the projects for ARP funds. Irwin wants all the departments to provide a narrative to all of their lists.

Chairperson Determann said they had a good meeting in Des Moines last week in regards to Highway 30.

County Treasurer Dustin Johnson reported he is already receiving calls from property owners asking for property tax statements. He wants to address calls coming to his office. He said 40% of those calls are not calls for the Treasurer's Office. He said he continues to work with the City of Clinton with 657A properties.

County Facilities Director Corey Johnson said the Board needs to review blueprints for the restroom replacement project at the Administration Building. He said the existing parking lot gravel was spotty so the project will continue as its originally planned base.

DISCUSSION WITH POSSIBLE ACTION

Elvira Wastewater Project Update: County Sanitarian Shane McClintock reported all the tanks are in and hooked up. He said some of the plumbing inside the homes need to be finished. He said most of the seeding has been completed and that work continues. He said he has worked with the home owners who had questions last week.

County Septic Tank Permit Process Review: McClintock reviewed the process and described how decisions are made on the systems allowed.

Solar Farms update: County Zoning Director Thomas Barnes reported no applications have been made. He understands the Board has been contacted about some of these issues. Mike Wolf said he would ask the Board to place a two-month moratorium on any applications for solar or wind utilities.

MOTION by Supervisor Srp to issue a two-month moratorium as recommended by the Zoning Director and County Attorney on applications for solar and wind operations.

Communications Radio Update: County Communications Director Eric Dau said the contract with EICC for the tower space has been signed. Dau said communications will be using the tower within three to four months. Dau said locating a backup tower is already being considered. He said they learned of a newer version of a Motorola radio. He said the radio relies on cellular network when out of range of a tower. He said mobile repeaters do that job now, but when they don't connect then they don't work. Dau said it is frustrating to find out now this is the newest radio available. He said these radios could replace the current radios, however the radio costs more and includes a maintenance contract. Srp said Motorola should have offered this new radio to the County at the time it was presented. County Sheriff Bill Greenwalt said these radios were being presented in late 2019. He said the radios the County purchased were offered at a 60% discount, but Motorola did not provide all the information on the newer radios. Greenwalt said he told Motorola the perception is they tried to move older stock on to Clinton County. He said Motorola was going to get back to the County with some answers. Irwin said the County asked Motorola multiple times about if this was the most modern system.

Wage Study Proposal Review: HR Director Dawn Aldridge said she has received two proposals for a County wage study. She reviewed both proposals. She said one cost estimate was \$99,500 and would be complete in six weeks. She said the other was broken down into steps with a total cost estimate of around \$40,000. Aldridge recommended moving forward with the Gallagher RFP. County Auditor Eric Van Lancker asked if the elected officials were being included in the study as the positions have different job duties and staff sizes. Aldridge said the study would

consider similar sized markets to Clinton County. Aldridge will ask Gallagher about providing information for elected officials and report back to the Board.
