ORDINANCE 2022-03

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CLINTON COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES BY REPEALING CHAPTER 1-4 (Ordinance 2011-01) ESTABLISHING VOTING PRECINCTS IN CONFORMANCE WITH THE POPULATION FOR 2020

Be It Ordained by the Board of Supervisors of Clinton County, Iowa:

SECTION 1. Purpose. Chapter 1-4 of the Clinton County Code of Ordinances is hereby repealed and a new Chapter adopted in its place, as follows:

1-4-1 CLINTON COUNTY VOTING PRECINCTS. The voting precincts for Clinton County are established as follow:

1-4-2 PRECINCT BOUNDARIES.

1. All of Brookfield Township and Bloomfield Township including the City of Delmar. This precinct includes, by agreement between the City of Maquoketa and the Clinton County Board of Supervisors, is to also include Census Tract 11, Block 1008.

2. Camanche Township. This precinct excludes, by agreement with the City of Camanche, Census Tract 8, Blocks 2001, 2002, 3002, 3005 which is included in Camanche Precinct 2. This precinct also excludes Census Tract 2 – Blocks 1027, 1028, 1032, 1033, 1034 that are included in Clinton 1st Ward 2nd Precinct, Census Tract 4 – Blocks 3055, 3056, and Census Tract 8 – Blocks 1009, 1008 that are included in the Center/Deep Creek/Goose Lake Precinct.

3. All of Center Township and all of Deep Creek Township including the City of Goose Lake. Also a portion beginning at the intersection of the east-bound centerlines of U.S. Highway 30 and County Road 380th Ave; Thence north on said centerline of 380th Avenue to the intersection of the north border of Camanche Township and the south border of Center Township; Thence east along said border of Camanche Township and Center Township to the west city limits of the City of Clinton, Iowa; Thence south along said west city limits of the City of Clinton, Iowa to the north city limits of the City of Low Moor, Iowa; Thence west along said city limits of the City of Low Moor to the centerline of 380th Ave; Thence north on said centerline of 380th Avenue to the intersection of the east-bound centerline of U.S. Highway 30, being the point of beginning. Also described as Camanche Township census blocks:

- B. Census Tract 8 Blocks 1009, 1008

13. Camanche Precinct 1: Camanche Precinct 1 shall exist as a Clinton County Precinct with boundaries within the incorporated limits of the City of Camanche as defined and approved by the Camanche City Council and certified by the Iowa Secretary of State, located entirely in Clinton County.

14. Camanche Precinct 2: Camanche Precinct 2 shall exist as a Clinton County Precinct with boundaries within the incorporated limits of the City of Camanche as defined and approved by the Camanche City Council and certified by the Iowa Secretary of State, located entirely in Clinton County. Camanche Precinct 2, by agreement between the City of Camanche and the Clinton County Board of Supervisors, is to also include Census Tract 8, Blocks 2001, 2002, 3002, 3005.

15. Clinton 1st Ward, 1st Precinct: Clinton 1st Ward, 1st Precinct shall exist as a Clinton County Precinct with boundaries within the incorporated limits of the City of Clinton as defined and approved by the Clinton City Council and certified by the Iowa Secretary of State, located entirely in Clinton County.

16. Clinton 1st Ward, 2nd Precinct: Clinton 1st Ward, 2nd Precinct shall exist as a Clinton County Precinct with boundaries within the incorporated limits of the City of Clinton as defined and approved by the Clinton City Council and certified by the Iowa Secretary of State, located entirely in Clinton County. Clinton 1st Ward, 2nd Precinct, by agreement between the City of Clinton and the Clinton County Board of Supervisors, is to also include Census Tract 2, Blocks 1027, 1028, 1032, 1033, 1034.

17. Clinton 2nd Ward, 1st Precinct: Clinton 2nd Ward, 1st Precinct shall exist as a Clinton County Precinct with boundaries within the incorporated limits of the City of Clinton as defined and approved by the Clinton City Council and certified by the Iowa Secretary of State, located entirely in Clinton County.

18. Clinton 2nd Ward, 2nd Precinct: Clinton 2nd Ward, 2nd Precinct shall exist as a Clinton County Precinct with boundaries within the incorporated limits of the City of Clinton as defined and approved by the Clinton City Council and certified by the Iowa Secretary of State, located entirely in Clinton County.

19. Clinton 3rd Ward, 1st Precinct: Clinton 3rd Ward, 1st Precinct shall exist as a Clinton County Precinct with boundaries within the incorporated limits of the City of Clinton as defined and approved by the Clinton City Council and certified by the Iowa Secretary of State, located entirely in Clinton County.

20. Clinton 3rd Ward, 2nd Precinct: Clinton 3rd Ward, 2nd Precinct shall exist as a Clinton County Precinct with boundaries within the incorporated limits of the City of Clinton as defined and approved by the Clinton City Council and certified by the Iowa Secretary of State, located entirely in Clinton County.

21. 24. DeWitt 2nd Ward, 1st Precinct: DeWitt 2nd Ward, 1st Precinct shall exist as a Clinton County Precinct with boundaries within the incorporated limits of the City of DeWitt as defined and approved by the DeWitt City Council and certified by the Iowa Secretary of State, located entirely in Clinton County.

1-4-3. AUTHORIZATION. The Chairperson is authorized to sign the precinct population certification and the County Auditor is directed to forward the certification to the office of Secretary of State.

SECTION 2. Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed. Specifically, Ordinance No. 2011-03 is repealed.

SECTION 3. Severability clause. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4. When effective. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect January 15, 2022, and upon posting as required by Iowa law.

GENERAL PUBLIC

Ray Ackerman, DeWitt, thanked the Board for reviewing the ME transport policy. He said the Board should consider that each funeral home charges a removal of remains for the family. He said that is usually a local transport. He said they should get together with the funeral homes to discuss those fees. He said the Board should try to get the transport service back into the hands of the funeral homes because the funeral homes handle those transports differently.

DEPARTMENT HEADS, ELECTED OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES

County Auditor Eric Van Lancker said County elected nomination papers are due in his office on Friday. He reminded the Board of its scheduled meetings this week on Tuesday and Thursday, both in regards to the solar projects in the County.

Supervisor Srp said he had a request from a landowner in a drainage district to increase the minimum payment to grow the sinking fund.

Supervisor Irwin said he had a question from a landowner in Drainage District #15 about disbanding the drainage district. Van Lancker said he could look that up and give him an overview of what the process includes.

County Engineer Todd Kinney said the DOT has requested permission to store a truck on one of the County properties. He said he will let them and just wanted the Board to know in case there was a question.

County Facilities Director Corey Johnson said Origin Design will measure all the ceilings in Administration Building for that project and will also meet with Origin Design and Kone about the Courthouse elevator project. He said the plans for the second floor bathroom will be posted next week. He said the energy audit was returned last week and there were no surprises in the audit. Johnson said he has also received requests from other departments about using new door locks.

County Treasurer Dustin Johnson said property tax collections are going well leading to the end of the month.

County EMA Director Chance Kness said Wednesday is the annual state-wide tornado drill. He said the County has not done a tornado drill in a couple of years due to COVID and recommended the County start that up again. He said he will schedule a drill for a later date. He said CERT basic training will be conducted during the first weekend in April.

DISCUSSION WITH POSSIBLE ACTION

County Property Mowing Budget: County Facilities Director Corey Johnson said he would like to meet with the contractors to be clear about what needs to be done in DeWitt and Manufacturing Drive. He recommends the mowing stay in house for the Courthouse and Administration Building and the rest of it be contracted to save on staff time. He will provide a resolution for next week's meeting to approve the contracts.

County ME Transport Policy: Kness presented a proposed policy update to the Board and reviewed it. The Board discussed going out for bids for backup services or potentially for contracting the entire service. Srp said it's hard to ask for a bid for the entire service when the people still in the conversation didn't put in a bid the last time this discussion happened a few years ago. Srp is interested in a contingency plan contract and a return trip bid. The Board asked Kness to get bids for contracting the entire service and for a contingency plan. Ackerman said putting out the service for funeral homes to bid is the best option for County. Kness also presented estimates for the remainder of the fiscal year as they are concerned a budget amendment will likely be needed.
