10:01 A.M. New Directions – ASAC update/presentation – Jennifer Gerdes, Michelle Cullen and Andrea Barnett

Jennifer Gerdes visited with the Board of Supervisors earlier in the year about tobacco free parks. She said there have been updates to her efforts since that discussion. She is currently surveying the campers that use the Clinton County Conservation campgrounds. She has also researched other County campgrounds including Scott County, which does have a tobacco-free park policy that makes all the public areas of the parks smoke-free. She presented an updated tobacco-free park policy to include emphasis on youth-structured activities.

Michelle Cullen, of the Visiting Nurses Association and the Blue Zones Project Committee, spoke about the Blue Zones initiative for the City of Clinton and its surrounding areas. She said the Blue Zones project is to promote healthy and happy lifestyles. She said smoke-free policies are throughout many Blue Zones communities.

Andrea Barnett, also with the Blue Zones Project Committee, reviewed the smoke-free sections of the 99-page Blue Zones application for the City of Clinton.

Gerdes added that smoke-free parks ordinances have been approved in other Iowa communities. She added they will also schedule a time to speak with the Board of Supervisors about the Blue Zones Project.

Schmidt said there are financial considerations to any position and that the FY13 budget is already set. He wanted to get the opinions of the other Board of Supervisor members.

Davisson said the smaller communities could benefit from something like this. It could be an economic tool. She believes the Board should pursue the idea, but added the budget is an issue. She said there could be opportunities for grant money to fund the position.

Staszewski asked O'Connell to explain what could be done. She said things are becoming more regionalized. She mentioned that people in our own County don't know about the small town celebrations. She said local activities should be promoted on the County's Web site.

Schmidt said consideration for funding this position could mostly come from conservation with assistance of a grant. He said the suggestion is worthy of consideration and looks forward to more input on the idea.

Davisson mentioned she has received many letters of support for the position.
