The Board of Supervisors of Clinton County, Iowa, met as the Board of Trustees for Drainage District #28. Present were Supervisors Davisson, Schmidt and Staszewski.

5:30 P.M. Public Meeting – Drainage District #28 – Review of Engineer’s Condition Report

PUBLIC MEETING

Chairperson Staszewski called the public meeting to order at 5:33 p.m. Present was Supervisors Davisson and Schmidt; County Auditor Eric Van Lancker; County Engineer Todd Kinney; County Zoning Administrator Gail Thomas; Department of Natural Resources representative Loran Jacobsen; and property owners John Kruse, Paul Kruse, Ken Shelly and Curt Kemmerer.

Kinney explained the meeting was to review the edited Engineer’s Condition Report. He said the major change to the report is removing the upper 2,800 feet from the original scope of the project. He said that was done because property owners said there would be no benefit to repairing that area. Kinney said that change reduced the cubic yard excavation cost and the seeding estimate. He said the project was originally estimated to cost \$65,000. The adjusted estimate to remove the 2,800 feet is now \$47,350. He said the new estimate would still require a bidding process.

It was the general agreement of those in attendance that the work needed to be done to improve the drainage of the area. It was also agreed the project should be conducted during the fall of 2012.

Kinney will move forward with arranging the appropriate Public Hearings.

Chairman Staszewski adjourned the meeting at 6:17 p.m.

The Board of Supervisors adjourned to meet on Tuesday, November 15, 2011.
