Coronavirus/COVID-19 update: Chairman Srp explained new information was received during and after the Board meeting on Monday that caused a discussion of closing County buildings to the public. He said County officials met Monday afternoon to discuss how to operate while the buildings are closed to the public. Plans were shared about how the County could continue to run while being closed to the public. State Representative Mary Wolfe said she knows the information coming out of Des Moines is not as clear as it could be and sometimes at the last minute, but she will share information as soon as she can.

RESOLUTION #2020-80

WHEREAS, Clinton County has determined the impact from the Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) Pandemic has disrupted government services and will endanger the health and safety of the citizens of Clinton County; now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board of Supervisors has declared a state of emergency authorized under Iowa State Statute and will execute the expenditure of emergency funds from all available sources, the invoking of mutual aid agreements and applying to the State of Iowa for assistance in response to this disaster.
