RESOLUTION #2020-223

WHEREAS, the fiscal year 2020-2021 budget for Clinton County requires a budget amendment as allowed per conditions under Iowa Code 331.435; and

WHEREAS, it is required per Iowa Code 331.435, Iowa Code 331.434(3) and Iowa Code 331.434(4) to set a time and place for a public hearing on the fiscal year 2020-2021 budget amendment to allow taxpayers to present objections to or arguments in favor of any part of the budget amendment; now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Clinton County, Iowa, that a public hearing be held on Monday, September 14, 2020, at 9:45 a.m. in person at the Clinton County Administration Building at 1900 N 3rd St., Clinton, IA; and electronically and the public may participate by phone by dialing 1-408-418-9388 and entering the access code 623839162 or the public may also join through the internet by following this web address: <https://globalpage-prod.webex.com/join> and enter meeting Code: 623839162 and then password clinton23; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Auditor is hereby directed to cause a publication to be made of a notice of the meeting in the official county newspapers and that such publication to be not less than 10 nor more than 20 days before the date of the public meeting on the fiscal year 2020-2021 budget amendment.

DISCUSSION WITH POSSIBLE ACTION

Elvira Wastewater Project Update: County Sanitarian Shane McClintock said the residents in the area were notified about this meeting and informed about the process and the agreements that will be used. McClintock said an estimated cost was provided at \$10,000 to \$15,000 per household. He said it will depend how construction goes at each home location. He is guessing it could be on the lower end of the current estimate for some. He said it would be in line to what a new septic system and landscaping would cost. He said the church may cost a little more since it is a larger property. McClintock reviewed more details of the proposed agreements. He said an electrical easement was added to the agreements and he also added to the agreement that the resident is responsible for maintenance and electrical costs for the system. County Treasurer Dustin Johnson explained the how the special assessment would appear on their tax bills to pay for the individual systems. McClintock said the bid process may have to be held until early next calendar year. McClintock said loans could be sought by homeowners, but he said the County is offering a loan without interest. The Supervisors said there is some flexibility on the amount of time for a resident to pay down the loan. They said 10 years is being used to start the conversation. County Attorney Mike Wolf said the Board would approve each agreement as the residents sign their individual agreement with the County.

The Board of Supervisors adjourned to meet on Monday, August 31, 2020.
