

NOVEMBER 9, 2020

The Board of Supervisors of Clinton County, Iowa, met. Present were Supervisors Srp, Determann and Irwin. Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Coronavirus/COVID-19 update: County Community Health Manager Michelle Cullen reported numbers are climbing off the charts across the State. She said the County had 542 on Thursday and is now at 809. Hospitalization has climbed dramatically during the weekend from 154 to 212 at Genesis. She said Genesis is asking for nurses to consider working hours in the hospital to help with staff shortages. Cullen said she continues to work with the schools as the rate of positives reach 23%. She said the students have seen few positives, but she said the staff is a different story. Cullen said she will be speaking with the State about the hospitalization and positivity rates and how schools should proceed. Supervisor Irwin said our citizens and especially our workforce at the County needs to be adhering to precautions. Cullen asked if the Board of Supervisors would put out a press release to increase awareness. The Board agreed they would do something to partner with public health. Cullen said they are finding that folks meeting in small groups for gatherings appear to be how it is spreading. She said it has also been as much from a couple going out to dinner. But she does not recommend going to a bar and hanging out and mingling with a large crowd. HR Director Dawn Aldridge said she is concerned about the County not having enough staff at some point to keep offices open. She said if schools shut down then the County could lose staff so parents can stay home with their children. Aldridge said there is an uptick in County employees experiencing positives or having positives in their home. Srp said the Board should consider at what point would they have to close buildings again.

David Peters, Clinton, said he was here last week to pay his full-year property taxes. He said there was a \$43 interest charge because it was delinquent. It was suggested he return next week when the discussion can be put on the agenda for a full discussion.

**DEPARTMENT HEADS, ELECTED OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES**

County Auditor Eric Van Lancker reported Election Day went smoother than expected and thanked the Board of their support of his office during the Election schedule. Van Lancker reminded the Board that they will meet again tomorrow to canvass the votes from the Election. He also reminded the Board that County buildings are closed on Wednesday in observance of Veteran's Day. He asked the Board how it would like to schedule meetings around the Thanksgiving holiday. It was generally decided not to meet the week of Thanksgiving.

**DISCUSSION WITH POSSIBLE ACTION**

911/Communications equipment replacement update: County Communications Director Eric Dau reported he distributed the latest numbers from Motorola on Friday. Dau said the Motorola costs don't include installation of a possible new tower. He said the total estimate of the project is now \$5.4 million. He said a decision now needs to be made as to whether to accept the Motorola estimate and then decide how the project will be paid. Dau said FEMA has reported that funding is unlikely from the federal declaration. Van Lancker said he could provide some financial options to pay for the project by next week's meeting.

Clinton County Development Association Update: CCDA Board Vice President Lester Shields reported the CCDA has previously provided funding for public safety projects and believes the communications equipment replacement could qualify. However, he can't make any assurances. He said the County would have to make the request through a one-page application. He also suggested the grant be written to be paid over multiple years. Shields said the association has not awarded funds to pay off debt.

County Administration Building Generator: No new reports were prepared for this topic.

Secondary Roads Update: County Engineer Todd Kinney distributed a written report which he reviewed with the Board. He said contract rock work has been done and graders are currently out now.

**9:47 A.M. Public Hearing**

Chairman Srp called a public hearing to order to solicit public comment on plans and specifications for the Elvira wastewater project.

Present were Supervisors Determann and Irwin, County Auditor Eric Van Lancker, County Sanitarian Shane McClintock, media and public.

Proof of publication was presented, accepted and returned for filing.

McClintock suggested rescheduling the public hearing as they were hoping to have more agreements from the residents than the one they've received.

One Elvira resident said there are a lot of questions about the end cost. He said he won't sign until those questions are answered. Srp said the contractors can't give a firm cost until they know how many have signed agreements. Srp said hopefully those answers can be provided during the meeting on Thursday. McClintock said these cost estimates are typically on the high end and may come in less than those estimates after the bids are submitted. McClintock said the

County is doing this for the financial benefit of the residents. He added that once they have at least 12 residents signed up then more specific plans can be made.

No comments were submitted previous to the hearing.
