RESOLUTIONS

Resolution 2023-205 discussion: County Community Assistance Director Kim Ralston said Linn County is fine with a six-month contract with Clinton County and it would automatically continue for another six months if it is not cancelled before then. County Attorney Mike Wolf visited with Scott County and its juvenile detention center will not be completed until September of 2024 in a best-case scenario. He said Scott County is interested in working with Clinton County once the facility is in operation. Wolf said the crisis of having enough beds in the state for juvenile detention is still persisting as they have recently found out with a situation with a local juvenile placement.

The following resolution was presented and on motion approved:

RESOLUTION 2023-205

WHEREAS, the Clinton County Supervisors recognizes federal requirements in regard to juvenile detention; and

WHEREAS, based on recommendations from the Clinton County Attorney and Clinton County Sheriff that outside juvenile detention is needed for Clinton County; now

THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clinton County Board of Supervisors authorizes the Clinton County Board of Supervisors Chairperson to sign a one-year contract with Linn County, Iowa, for juvenile detention and diversion services.

DEPARTMENT HEADS, ELECTED OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES

Supervisor Srp said the Conservation Foundation annual meeting was last week and November 4 will be the annual fundraising dinner at Rock Creek. Srp said the Early Childhood and DCAT programs will be looking for a new coordinator.

County Treasurer Dustin Johnson said tax bills will hit mailboxes later this week or early next week.

County HR Director Ally Ellison said employees and members of the community have asked about promoting job openings better. She reported on two positions open now and they are featured on the county website.

County Veterans Affairs Director John Bray said he will leave tomorrow for his deployment with the National Guard. He said he has worked with part-time staff to provide coverage in the County VA office while he is out.

County Conservation Director Phil Visser reported the Fishing Has No Boundaries event this weekend was well attended. He said the Conservation Board will talk about electrical renovations at Rock Creek. He said they will also discuss the replacement of some restroom facilities. He said the Catfish Classic will be August 27. He added they are still looking for some seasonal concession stand workers.

DISCUSSION WITH POSSIBLE ACTION

County Medical Examiner Investigator/Transport Program: Chairman Irwin said he wanted to discuss this to bring the other Supervisors into the discussion of relieving some of the strain on the EMA office. He said the drone program has already been moved out of EMA and a plan is being developed to move the MEI program out of EMA. Irwin said they are looking at meeting with Muscatine and Marshall counties about their programs. Srp said he listened to the EMA commission meeting last week and gathered a lot of information from that. He said he's just making sure all the important aspects are covered if the program moves. Irwin said they received more information during the weekend and he was thankful for that. He said they are trying to schedule visits to the previously mentioned counties for more ideas about how to run the program. Irwin said Van Lancker has stepped up to see if there is anything his office can do to help with the program. Irwin reminded everyone the MEI program is under the Board of Supervisors discretion even though it currently is assigned to EMA. Supervisor Srp said the timeline of

reviewing this program is needed to address some other issues in EMA. He added EMA has been good stewards of the program, but realizes it is overburdened. Srp said he is openminded to various outcomes. Ashton Schulz, an MEI investigator, said at some point the Board will need to look at EMS in the County. He thought maybe that could be an EMS/MEI coordinator position. Schulz said he's concerned about the all call concept that has been talked about. Srp said the County EMS and fire districts has been talked about recently and is moving forward. Chance Kness, County EMA Director, said this has never been about not wanting to do it. He added his solution was to add a parttime MEI coordinator. He said this is a 24/7/365 role to operate this program. Kness said that person will need to make decisions in the moment. Irwin said he had a discussion with Dr. Malcom previously and she said she would take care of the MEIs, but she needed assistance with the scheduling, payroll and ordering supplies. He asked why someone would need a call at 1:30 a.m. that wouldn't go to her. Dr. Malcom said there was an instant when there were issues in a home and the MEI person needed assistance. Kness said sometimes there is a need for a second call out and Dr. Malcom is also unavailable from time to time. She said multi casualty issues are difficult to address, whether it is one scene or more than one call at the same time. Dr. Malcom said the Board of Supervisors should not be responsible how the MEI is scheduled. Srp said by code the program is our responsibility. Srp said he's not interested in micro-managing the program, but the Board has ultimate responsibility for it. He would like to hear about other options. Irwin said visits with outside counties are being arranged. Irwin said this meeting was for an update and nothing for decision today.
