ORDINANCE 2024-02

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Clinton County, Iowa:

Section 1. Pursuant to published notice, a public hearing has been duly conducted on February 26, 2024, and the Board of Supervisors hereby suspend the rules for second hearing hereby adopts the Clinton County, Iowa Code of Ordinances.

Section 2. An official copy of the County Code as adopted, including a certification by the County Auditor as to its adoption and effective date is on file at the office of the County Auditor.

Section 3. A copy of the code shall be kept available at the office of the County Auditor in the County Administrative Building for public inspection and copies will be made available for sale at cost.

Section 4. All general ordinances or parts thereof passed prior to March 4, 2024, not contained in the Clinton County, Iowa, Code of Ordinances are hereby repealed except as hereafter provided, or special ordinances not named.

Section 5. The following ordinances are specifically saved from repeal:

1. Zoning Ordinances, and other Ordinances related to Zoning
2. Grade Ordinances
3. Vacating Streets and Roads
4. Flood Plain Ordinance
5. Subdivision Ordinance

Section 6. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon publication as required by Iowa law.

WHEREAS, the City of Clinton, Iowa, (the "City") has recently acquired ownership of 121 6th Avenue, Clinton, Iowa, and the City has proposed a new lease agreement (the "Lease Agreement") with the County for the continued lease of the Premises for a five-year initial lease term and up to two five-year renewal terms; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that the continued lease of the Premises for the above identified offices, under the terms and conditions proposed in the Lease Agreement, would further a public purpose and is in the best interests of the County and the residents thereof, now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of Clinton County in the State of Iowa that the form and content of the Lease Agreement, the provisions of which are incorporated herein by reference, be and the same hereby are in all respects authorized, approved and confirmed, and the Chairperson is authorized, empowered and directed to execute the Lease Agreement for and on behalf of the County in substantially the form and content now before this meeting, but with such changes, modifications, additions or deletions therein as shall be approved by the Chairperson and County Auditor.

DEPARTMENT HEADS, ELECTED OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES

County Auditor Eric Van Lancker reported on a committee that met last week to review the security cameras at the Law Center and Jail. He said additional meetings with vendors are being scheduled. He added the Clinton County Resource Center grant has been submitted for year three.

Supervisor George said she appreciates Clinton County staying ahead of the property tax changes from the State. She said it appeared at ISAC last week in Des Moines that some counties were not as prepared as Clinton County.

County Sheriff Bill Greenwalt said the State jail inspection is this week. He said deputy testing was done this week and the list was much shorter than usual but had enough to qualify for upcoming openings.

County Treasurer Dustin Johnson said 67% of second half property tax collections have been submitted. He said there were some larger tax sale redemptions last week.

County Engineer Todd Kinney said he is still waiting to hear back from the attorney reviewing the Drainage District policy updates. He said the Secondary Road fund will need a budget amendment to cover a couple of expenses.

DISCUSSION WITH POSSIBLE ACTION

Review Administration Building Renovation Bids: County Facilities Director Corey Johnson reported there were five bids received and all competitive within about \$100,000 of each other. He said he's working with Construction Attorney Jeff Stone, Van Lancker and Chairman Irwin to review the bids. He said a recommendation will be given next week to the Board. Johnson said the bids were all above estimates by about \$400,000. He said there is a deduct in the bids that would cover that, but the deduct is for a ceiling replacement project that will eventually need to be done. He said they are working on receiving completion dates from the bidders and hoped to have a recommendation for the bid award next week.

Review County Snow Fence and Wind Break Policy: Kinney explained the County Attorney has reviewed the suggested changes which are mostly based on Iowa DOT policy. He said updates provide more options for wind breaks and these breaks would be sought out by the County. He said sites may cost \$200-\$500 each so a lot of them could be done for \$10,000 or less.

Review Temporary Construction Easement Proposal for the County-Owned Property Located on Manufacturing Drive in Clinton: Van Lancker reviewed the agreement that would pay the county \$1,565. He said the City reported the work will begin this time next year.

MOTION by Supervisor Srp to authorize the chairman to sign the construction easement agreement.

County Department Head Policy Review: County Human Resources Director Alexandra Ellison said the department head days off do not line up with what is in the employee handbook. Ellison suggested it stay consistent for all employees. Srp said he doesn't want to add wellness back into the leadership positions. He thought increasing the personal days would be the best. Ellison said they would still have to earn the wellness days, which aren't guaranteed while the personal days are guaranteed. The matter will be discussed further.

Review of the County-Wide Tax Levy Mailing: Van Lancker thanked Budget Director Nicholas Manrique for his time working on this mailer late Friday night and early Saturday morning. Van Lancker showed examples of what the letter will look like. He said several calls from this mailer are anticipated in the Auditor's, Treasurer's and Assessor's offices.

Medical Examiner Investigator/Transporter Discussion: Ellison said there are new federal rules that basically state the medical examiner investigators must be treated as employees as opposed to their current status as contractors. EMA Director Chance Kness said they were already looking at a new process to pay MEIs as they were having difficulty finding people to cover the shifts. Kness said they have looked at changing to a flat rate for a call and increasing that rate. He said they also started looking at medical examiner transporters on-call pay because of the new rules. Ellison said legal counsel has recommended removing on-call pay. Kness said that on-call pay is a total of about \$12,000 in the budget. He said that will be shifted to the rate paid for each call. He said the transporters may lose pay by removing the on-call pay. Kness said the contracts end at the end of June. He said there is a hiring process that will need to be done to switch the investigators to employees. Irwin requested more information on the MET program including the fuel, insurance and service on the MET vehicle. The Board asked for a resolution next week to reflect the change to higher call rates without on-call hours.
