Thiltgen called the meeting to order at 7:32 a.m. The hybrid meeting was held with the option of teleconference participation. Roll call showed 3 members present in the meeting room. It was moved by Lovaas, seconded by Morgan, to Approve the June 26th, 2025 minutes as submitted. Motion carried 3-0.

AGENDA ITEM III - BOARD OF HEALTH

Eggers noted that House File 706 requires that all newly appointed board members are mandated to take a one-to-two-hour course regarding open meeting laws and records within 90 days of their term starting. **Thiltgen** commented that some do not fall under the category for the training, such as the new Veteran's Affairs Director as she is a hired employee.

AGENDA ITEM V – DEPARTMENT REPORTS

- A. Environmental Services- McClintock was present with no new updates.
- B. MercyOne Genesis VNA & Hospice–McClimon requested approval to sign the Public Health subcontracts. It was moved by Lovaas, seconded by Morgan, to APPROVE the subcontracts. Motion carried 3-0. A handout was submitted. McClimon notes an uptick in communicable diseases, but they have no common denominator and are mostly GI issues.
- C. Maternal Child and Adolescent Health (MCAH)- Unable to attend but previously mentioned they had no new updates.
- D. Hillcrest Family Services/WIC— Kaczinski noted they are now with CHC and will follow under that section from now on. Their new location is 925 South 4th Street in Clinton. Participation in July was up from June with 4428 participants enrolled. The WIC food program is going through a review. They may be making changes to keep the program in line with dietary guidelines and offer more choices as well.
- E. Early Childhood Iowa/DECAT- Wirth stated she is working with Women's Health Services on a grant to provide essential needs to young families. This could include diapers, formula, wipes, etc. Their Literacy Grant will be funding the Dolly Parton Imagination Library. She is also currently busy with 3-year-old preschool scholarship applications.
- F. Women's Health and Family Services— Montgomery requested approval of the 1st quarter Rapid HIV Testing claim and 1st quarter Teen Success claim. It was moved by Morgan, seconded by Lovaas, to Approve said claims. Motion carried 3-0. Montgomery noted the collaboration with ECI and that they have many families looking for these items. Their new health educator, Elizabeth, was hired and is currently training to gear up this fall on the Teen Success program in the schools. They have completed 50 Rapid HIV/Syphilis tests with zero positive for HIV and 1 positive for Syphilis this year so far.
- **G. Community Health Care, Inc- Eacker** noted that since joining WIC they are offering medical and dental services for children. They have a pediatric dentist still offering services once per month, and tomorrow she will see 50 patients. Other providers in the area have recently left, so they have had an influx of patients. They are still offering the Medication Recovery Program for drug and alcohol addiction.
- H. Clinton Substance Abuse Council (GIC & CDC)- Schwandt said they are at the end of their Drug Free Communities Grant. They are attempting to apply for a no cost extension as they have some funding left. The Back to School Bash is tomorrow from 7 to 10 pm for grades 4 8 at the DeWitt Community Center. They will have games, prizes, and food. Thiltgen noted the wonderful youth group that is promoting the

event. Schwandt said that nine youth recently went to Nashville to attend a four-day leadership conference. Weets noted that she works with the SPF-RX Grant regarding prescription drug misuse. They have been busy with events and lots of programming. She was able to get into the Clinton Community College to present to nursing students and has been busy with Narcan training. Regarding academic detailing, she has been going in the MercyOne department meetings and talking about the prescription monitoring program and best practices. The providers can check their own practices prescribing medication and compare it to their peers. They can also check records and see what prescriptions the patient has been prescribed previously. Huisenga applied for a grant that promotes water safety keeping drugs out of the water system. They also received 200 - 250 lock bags for medication. Smith continues working on the PFS-PAM Grant. Their sustainability plan was approved, and they recently posted a banner by Life Connections on Lincoln Way. The Iowa DOT states that 17,700 cars drive by that sign on a daily basis. She is still looking for places in the DeWitt area to place the banner. Huisenga noted that most teens do not use substances. Prevention is key as 9 out of 10 adults that have a substance use disorder started drinking or smoking before age 18. They encourage parents to talk early and talk often as well as to act quickly if they suspect their child is using. The Clinton Crush vigil is next Wednesday at 4:00 at the Bandshell. They focus on awareness, and remember those who are still struggling with addiction, while celebrating those in recovery. They received a grant from the Governor's Traffic Safety Bureau to start focusing on impaired driving in October. Huisenga is in search of condoms, harm reduction kits, and wound care kits. **Montgomery** will contact her about their state issued condom supply.

- I. Area Substance Abuse Council (ASAC)/New Directions- Regenwether stated she received an update from Kyle Mecham who couldn't attend. As of September 1st, they will be offering youth outpatient substance use programming. They will have weekly group sessions, likely on Friday afternoons because of the school early dismissals. In October, they will start some family engagement, programming, and curriculum things to strengthen support systems at home. They are currently accepting referrals. Regarding prevention, in the beginning of August, all Clinton County Conservation staff completed Narcan training. Narcan will be placed in the county parks next to the AED units. Historically, they have offered the Community Mental Health Awareness Night in May. Moving forward, they may have it at the end of February. May is a busy month with graduation, state track, prom, etc.
- J. Bridgeview Community Mental Health Center— Snyder has now been with Bridgeview 90 days. On September 19th at noon, they will be hosting an open house. They want people to feel comfortable with coming in. Grow Clinton will be there and do a ribbon cutting. They have been making a lot of positive changes. The Integrated Home Health services are now closed. The BHIS program serves ages 4 to 18 if they are on Medicaid. They will have two of their NP staff leaving next month, but two will remain. They are also hoping to hire a new mental health therapist.
- K. Emergency Management- Not in attendance.
