##### RESOLUTION 2026-13

WHEREAS, pursuant to Iowa code section 445.16 it is impractical to pursue collection of the total amount due through the tax sale or personal judgment remedies. The Treasurer has submitted a written compromise with Keith Boysen collecting agreeable real estate taxes of \$350. Upon satisfaction of the compromise, the Treasurer requests the abatement of the outstanding charges for the following Buildings on Leased Land from tax year 2022 and 2023:

Whereas, it is desired by and in the interest of Clinton County to participate fully in the BUILD project activities as a Sub-recipient and provide all requisite information necessary to bring to completion all project phases through final completion, and

Whereas, we are in support of Butler County providing Lead-recipient roles and duties, and

Whereas, we understand and accept the Sub-recipient roles and responsibilities as defined in the "28E Cooperative Agreement for a Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (BUILD) Grant Project", and

Whereas, each County Bridge Sponsor shall be responsible for all local matching funds and accepts any costs exceeding the funds requested in the BUILD Grant application for their respective structure.

#### DEPARTMENT HEADS, ELECTED OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES

Supervisors shared their appreciation for the work of the Sheriff's Department and Jail Staff in supporting the transition of medical care in the jail. They also shared their meeting schedule for the week.

Auditor preparing for Drainage District elections over the weekend.

Treasurer's staff has done 17% more title transfers than the previous year resulting in increased revenue to the county.

The sheriff praised the administrative staff for major cost-saving improvements at the jail. Prescription services were moved from an out-of-state pharmacy to a local provider, saving money and keeping funds in the community. A nurse practitioner has also been brought in, which will reduce hospital transports and improve inmate care. In addition, mental health services will now be provided through local partners at little to no cost.

Human Resources is asking community members to volunteer for the committee, especially those with disabilities or who work with people with different abilities. Their input is needed to help make county buildings and parks more accessible. Interested individuals can submit a letter of inquiry or apply online through the county website

Conservation: The county is working with a consultant and an engineering firm on a possible dredging project at Rock Creek. More information and preliminary cost estimates.
