DEPARTMENT HEADS, ELECTED OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES

Supervisors shared their meeting schedule for the week.

Auditor: Reminded the public of the June 2nd primary election

Treasurer: Multiple treasurer-related bills are moving forward, including a discussion of improving the disabled and elderly property tax credit. And for upcoming property tax collections continue.

EMA: a scheduled emergency preparedness exercise was postponed after FEMA notified officials that travel restrictions prevented evaluation, leaving the new date unknown but still required to be completed this year.

Building Maintenance: The new boilers at the Law Center are being installed this week and are expected to be completed within a few days, that bids for new card readers at the Law Center have been received and will be presented at the next board meeting, and that a long-term, non-urgent plan is being explored to refurbish the courthouse’s vintage light poles—many of which include brass dedication plaques honoring veterans—by repainting and freshening them to improve their overall condition and appearance.

Human Resources: The speaker reports that the Polar Plunge took place over the weekend, was a memorable experience, and raised about \$2,500 for the Conservation Board, then recognized Scott Harris for approaching his first anniversary as a medical examiner transporter, and concluded by highlighting current county job openings, including reserve and deputy positions with the Sheriff’s Office and a full-time custodial role at the administration building, encouraging the public to share and apply.

Conservation: This year’s Polar Plunge was probably the coldest on record, thanks to participants and supporting agencies—including local fire and rescue, the dive team, and the Sheriff’s Department. Please follow the Conservation Facebook page for upcoming programs, including watercolor activities at Rock Creek, outdoor exploration, and craft events, noting that engaging activities continue despite winter weather.
